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Development Of Sensory Systems

What is sensory development? In general, it refers to the maturing of the five familiar senses: hearing, smell, taste, touch, and vision. It also involves the way your baby or child's nervous system receives input from these senses and then forms an appropriate motor or behavioral response. This is known as sensory processing or sensory integration.

Note that other species have a range of additional sensory systems (magnetoreception). Portions of the eye, nose and ear appear very early in development each as a specialized surface ectoderm region (placode) on the embryo.

Sensory System Development - Embryology

Sensory development begins during gestation and continues throughout childhood. There are seven sensory processes: taste, smell, touch, hearing, seeing, body position sense (called proprioception), and movement sensations (called vestibular input).

Sensory Processing (or Integration as it is also known) is the effective registration (and accurate interpretation) of sensory input in the environment (including one's body). It is the way the brain receives, organises and responds to sensory input in order to behave in a meaningful & consistent manner. All the sensory systems need to work together for effective sensory processing. It is important to recognise that there are in fact 7 senses that make up the sensory system and it is these sensory systems that process information as the building blocks to many other skills. Visual sense: is the ability to understand and interpret what is seen. The visual system uses the eyes to receive information about contrast of light and dark, colour and movement.
