### Michaels Cue Bid

Michaels is a cue-bid that promises a two-suited hand, with at least five cards in each suit. There is no point minimum for making a Michaels overcall, although obvious factors like vulnerability should be considered. Some partnerships also agree to specific ranges (see "Other Considerations", below).

### Michaels Cue Bid Bridge Convention - Bidding and Responses

The Michaels cuebid is a conventional bid used in the card game contract bridge. First devised by Michael Michaels of Miami Beach, FL, it is an overcaller's cuebid in opponent's opening suit and is normally used to show a two-suited hand with at least five cards in each suit and eight or more points.

Michaels cue-bid is a defensive convention for showing a two-suited hand. There is not a commonly accepted strength range, it is a matter of partnership agreement.

There is a school of thought that a Michaels bid should be avoided with a medium hand such as: A Q 7 6 4 A Q 10 7 6 5 4 2. The thinking is that when partner chooses a major, you won't know whether or not a game is in the picture. For that reason, many players choose to define Michaels as "weak/preemptive or very strong--not in-between."

Variations to the Michaels Cuebid include: restricting its use to weak/strong hands (less than 12 points or more than 15 points), allowing 4 cards in the higher of the two suits, etc. Michael's Cuebid was created by Charles Goren's playing partner, Michael Michaels.

### Michaels Cuebid: Bridge Bidding Convention

The Michaels cuebid — brain-child of the late Mike Michaels — allows a player to describe a two-suited hand in one bid in competitive auctions. It is typically reserved for hands with a 5-5 (or longer) pattern. When a player bids a suit which has originally been called by the opponents, that player has made a cuebid.

### PLAY BRIDGE Michaels Cuebid - ACBL

Originally devised by Michael Michaels of Miami. These are actually two different conventions, but they are usually bundled together to give one coherent approach. There are a few variations, but the basic mechanism involves cue-bidding the opponents' opening suit (e.g. (1♦), 2♦) or jumping to 2NT over the opening bid.

An overcall in opponent's suit is called a Michael's cue bid, and is basically looking for Majors. The bids can also be used to tell your partner when you have 2 long suits where one is a Major the other a minor. The two systems work in much the same way.

The Michaels Cuebid and Unusual Notrump are conventions that let you show two suits with one bid. The convention you use depends on which suit the opponent opens and which suits you have.

### Michaels Cuebids & Unusual Notrump Overcalls

There is a conventional defense against the Michaels Cuebid. After an enemy cuebid that shows a two-suited hand, responder's conventional bids are: Responder's priority is to show major-suit support, either via a direct raise or cuebid. Below are all the responses in greater detail.

### Defense to Michaels Bridge Convention - Bidding and Responses

Michaels Cue Bid A cue bid is a bid in the same suit as opponent. For example, opponent bids 1♦; you or your partner bid 2♦. This bid should not be used to show strength in opponent's suit.

106542 43, a 1S overcall is a better description than a Michaels cue bid. Be careful if your high-card strength is outside your suits. With a hand like K8532 J8642 K5 Q your suits are too weak for a Michaels Cuebid. Vulnerable Michaels Cuebid should promise more playing strength. Responding bids

### Michaels Cuebid for the Majors

This is called the Michaels Cuebid. It is a convention invented by Mike Michaels in early days of bridge to describe a two-suited hand of less than opening strength. The cuebid of a major suit opening, says you have five cards in the other major and five in one of the minors.

### THE MICHAELS CUEBID; A HANDY CONVENTION

Michaels Cuebid This is a direct cuebid of the opponent's opened suit (1C by RHO, 2C by you) to show 5+-card length in two other suits. One of your suits is always a major, but the exact two you promise depend on the opening bid:

The Michaels cue bid is useful in the direct seat after an opening bid because it provides a way to describe a hand with five or more pieces in two suits. If the bid was in one of the minor suits, the cue-bidder is telling his partner that he has at least five in each of the major suits.
