## **Tackling Gender Stereotypes webinar - Women In Sport**

Gender stereotypes are particularly pervasive in sport and physical activity. Metheny (1965) identified gender stereotypes in her classic analysis, concluding that it was not appropriate for women to engage in activities involving bodily contact, force, or endurance. Despite women's increased participation, those gender stereotypes persist 50 years later.

## **Gender and Cultural Diversity in Sport, Exercise, and ...**

Media representations of sports and athletes can contribute to the construction of harmful gender stereotypes. Media tend to represent women athletes as women first and athletes second. Coverage of women in sports is often dominated by references to appearance, age or family life, whereas men are depicted as powerful, independent, dominating, and valued as athletes.

## **Gender Equality in Sports Media - UNESCO**

We revert to the stereotype of the elite competitor based on what we see in the male pathway of athletic behavior, perpetuating the notion that females find different values in sports than males. The perception exists that female athletes are more socially minded and risk-averse.

However, even though many female athletes have been discouraged from participating in male dominated sports, women have continued to break stereotypes and cultural barriers that have prevented them from participating in "manly" sports.

## **Powerful campaign to blitz female sport stereotypes**

Although sex stereotypes and gender roles also share similarities, they are not identical: stereotypes refer to descriptions (e.g., men participate more in sport than women) and gender roles refer to prescriptions (e.g., men are supposed to participate more in sport than women).

## **The influence of sex stereotypes and gender roles on ...**

To this day there are very noticeable differences in women's sports compared the nature of men's sports. Women and men alike experience their inequalities in sports. For example, of you were to ask a group of people what they would rather watch: women's basketball or men's basketball; generally speaking the majority of the group would favor watching men's basketball.

From knee push-ups becoming "girl push-ups" to the classic cliché "you throw like a girl", language can reveal stereotypes about women in sport. This simultaneously links femininity with poor athletic ability and shames men for having these qualities. While this type of blatant insult is becoming more and more stigmatised, women still face stereotypes, particularly in the media.

## **How language shapes gender stereotypes in sport ...**

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Gender stereotypes are one of the key barriers preventing more women and girls getting active. Less than half of girls say they have the same choice as boys at school in sport and exercise; and among secondary school-age children, being 'sporty' is still widely seen as a masculine trait.

Media Exposure of Women's Sports Gender inequality, as noted, has many negative consequences for female athletes. In addition to the unequal type of coverage that female athletes receive, they also receive less overall coverage (8, 19, 30, 47, 56). Women's sports are also perceived as less exciting and slower than men's sports (40).

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
